





The Fringe Society is committed to removing barriers and ensuring the Fringe is as open and accessible as possible.

A dedicated Access Bookings team work as part of the Fringe Box Office, and are in place to specifically handle access enquiries and ticket bookings.

Other initiatives include free-to-borrow sensory resources for neurodivergent people, a captioning and audio description equipment borrowing scheme for Fringe companies and vneues, provision of BSL interpretaiton of street performance, a Fringe-wide online equalites training programme, and numerous other projects and resources aimed at breaking down the barriers to participation in the Fringe as a venue, performer or audience member.
